Introduction

Everybody wants to be happy and this implies scientific developments (technology) and social development (human rights) to achieve physical and emotional comfort.

Due to human and material waste that we can see everywhere, our society of free competition is reaching the limit of evolution that it can endure. Despite the race for process optimization, technology creates unemployment and the financial system generates debt. In fact, the more technology we have, more waste is generated. This way, it would not be possible to maintain the technological and social evolution for much longer. This will eventually destroy the system of free competition during this century.

Now we face different problems and we need different solutions.

And the solution involves switching to a system of free cooperation. This requires only 2 things:

- 1 - Ensuring human rights.
- 2 - Create a fair monetary system.
- 3- Create a world system of human resource management.

With this, we can ensure the happiness of all people on the planet. In the 16th century, Thomas More stated that if there was no waste then all people on the planet could live comfortably working only 6 hours a day. So, with today's technology, everybody should be rich... We can make atomic bombs, we can send people to the moon, so, why can't we put an end to all crisis? The solution is already known long ago. If we change the structure of society to a basis of cooperation then a cooperative society will emerge. Technically, this is easy to achieve. A society of free cooperation has a much simpler organization than a society of competition. Moreover, as there is no waste in a cooperative society, it is much cheaper to keep a cooperative society rather than a competitive society.

Then, why we still do not have a *paradise*? This is because it's not possible to create a *paradise* in a competitive

society and because people do not want to move to a cooperative society. It's no use to blame the politicians. Unfortunately, politicians do not have the capacity to change society due to several factors: selfish opposition of the rich and powerful and the opposition of ignorant people, etc. The selfish will never change his mind, so the only thing we can do is to inform the people the advantages of a cooperative society. It is necessary that the majority of the people agree to change the current system. For this **it is essential that people be informed that there is a solution** to turn the Earth into a *paradise*. Unfortunately, people will demand changing only when most people are in misery. This means one more century of needless suffering...

The purpose of this book is to **warn the people** of approaching even harder times and **give people hope** because soon there will be enough people that will want to create a better world. Therefore, we appeal to the people to withstand with courage the trials that lie ahead and when the time comes make the decisions wisely.
